



PRIVATE AND HOME SCHOOL STUDENT DATA COLLECTION

New federal data sharing regulations require that we collect student data from private schools/home schools, and public schools. To accomplish this requirement, MSDRS has developed letters to be given to parents of private school or home school students once students have been identified by the Recruiter during the interview process. The letters are located on the Migrant Student Information System (MSIS) website:

The letters instruct the parents to collect their student data information and mail it to MSDRS for entry into MSIS. MSDRS will no longer enroll private or home-schooled students in your out of school district ID, but rather a private or home school ID created within the MSIS. If you currently have migrant eligible students in your district attending a private school or being home schooled, email your request to create a building ID to Margaret Lopez, mlopez@msdr.org.

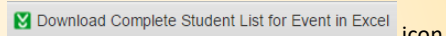
SERVICE DELIVERY PLAN REQUIRES LOCAL ASSESSMENT DATA REPORTING

Washington State's new Migrant Education Program Service Delivery Plan (SDP) calls for measuring progress of students served through MEP funds in the areas of Math and English Language Arts. Therefore, MSDRS is collecting pre- and post- assessment scores for students who are receiving migrant funded services in these areas.

Once these assessments are administered, records clerks must report pre and post ELA or Math results into the MSIS in order to ensure accurate data is available for evaluation purposes.

Congratulations to the hundreds of migrant students who participated in 2017 Dare to Dream academies! TO CONTINUE TO SUPPORT ACADEMY PARTICIPANTS WITH THEIR ACADEMICS, STUDENT VOICE AND LOCAL ENGAGEMENT...



- **Identify 2017 Participants:** Login to MSDRS, select the academies tab/event, then click the icon. The list will include all eligible students including details of which students registered, participated, and earned credit.
- **Credit Earned:** Check with your registrar or counselor to determine if credit has been added to the local student academic record. Students who participated for the full duration of the event were sent home with an official transcript reflecting a .5 credit in math, science, or an elective.
- **Migrant Student Voice and Engagement:** Provide opportunities for students to share their experience and build their public speaking skills:
 - **PAC and Classroom Presentations:** Invite past participants to speak at an upcoming (PAC) meeting and/or student meetings, classrooms. This could be a great strategy to support local recruitment efforts for the 2018 academies!
 - **School Board Presentation:** Organize presentations to the local school board at an upcoming meeting.

WHAT ABOUT PARENT ENGAGEMENT? Former and future academy participants need support to maintain motivation to attend events, complete post-secondary applications, scholarship applications, etc. Involve the students' parents in serving as a champion for their child to participate in the academies and pursue their post-secondary education pathway. **How to do that? Support parent awareness and education of the world of post-secondary education, Dare to Dream Opportunities and educational pathways. Dispel any fears or myths about Dare to Dream by:**

- Coordinating a student/parent visit with university(ies) CAMP(s)
- Invite student participants to share their experience, journals, video clips, at PAC meetings, DTD webinars, etc.

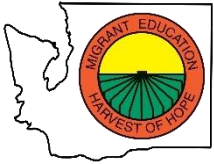
