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MIGRANT STUDENT COUNT RISE

GREAT NEWS. Even though we had a snowy February which reduced recruitment activities, our state migrant student counts are higher than last year at this time.

Great Job Migrant Education Program Recruiters. To maintain student counts, recruiters are encouraged to:

- Review local listings, registration forms of students new to your school district and interview possible eligible families;
- Re-interview families who may have moved this past winter and have returned. If the move this past winter was a qualifying move, it will extend their eligibility once a new COE is created and perhaps identify the students as priority of service, which will increase your local school district migrant funding allocation; and
- Run the **District Enrollment Status Report** and verify all students identified in the 2017-18 school year have been re-identified for this school year (if appropriate).

GIVING CREDIT WHERE CREDIT IS DUE

Kudos to recruitment staff in the following school districts where the numbers of COEs completed this year have already exceeded the number of COEs complete in ALL of last year. Great job in getting out there and identifying our migrant families.

PASS HELPING MIGRANT STUDENTS GRADUATE ONE COURSE AT A TIME

SENIOR ENROLLMENT DEADLINE: With spring conferences underway, PASS contacts are encouraged to meet with counselors to identify which students may need PASS to make up needed credits. Senior enrollment deadline for seniors planning to graduate Spring 2019 is **May 15**.

SUMMER SCHOOL PRE-SHIPMENT OPTION: Do you plan to host a summer school using the PASS curriculum? MIGRANT FUNDED SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES



When a migrant funded staff provides supplemental services to a migrant student, the Migrant Program Records Clerk is required to report the service into the Migrant Student Information System (MSIS). Services need to be reported in a timely manner. The Records Clerk should have an efficient means in place to gather this data.

TIP: Once all students are enrolled, the Records Clerk can utilize the “**Student Supplemental Service Report**” located under Reports, Educational category and Supplemental. This report displays all Academic and Non-Academic Services by student and by building. The RC can route this report to migrant funded staff with instructions to check off the services for those students who are being served. The report can then be routed back to the RC for reporting into the MSIS.



Supplemental services are only reported **one time** a year per category unless, the student leaves and comes back in the same year. In this situation the RC would need to report in the second enrollment line what service the student received upon his/her return.

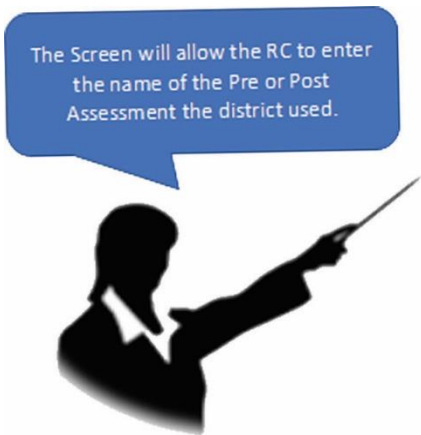

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ASSESSMENT REPORTING

- ❖ **STATE STANDARDIZED ASSESSMENTS:** Required state standardized assessments are administered annually and uploaded into the MSIS, from OSPI’s state database for the previous school year.
- ❖ **LOCAL STANDARDIZED ASSESSMENTS:** The Migrant Records Clerk enters Regular school year and Summer (if applicable) local standardized assessments into the MSIS, such as AIM, DIAL, DRA-EDL, ITBS, MAP, NWEA or STAR.
- ❖ **PRE AND POST ASSESSMENTS:** If the district serves students in **ELA or Math** supplemental services with migrant funds; the Records Clerk is required to enter a **Pre and Post Assessment** including the test name for each student who receives a service in these supplemental categories.
